Although the weather over the winter allows residents to take a break from constant yard maintenance, it does not allow you to stop all together. The HOA has noticed a lot of weeds popping up, and now is the perfect time for you to be spraying to prevent further weeds and new weeds in the summer.

Declaration of Protective Covenants Conditions and Restrictions for StoneyBrooke Item 17. VEHICLE PARKING: Vehicle parking in driveways and/or on the street in front of houses shall be limited to temporary parking of guest or resident vehicles in current use and currently licenses. Other vehicles must be parked in garages.

Regarding the word "temporary", the developer has chosen to allow residents a twenty-four (24) hour period of time in which they may park guest or resident vehicles in current use and currently licensed on the street.

However, residents have been taking advantage of this temporary parking rule, and have been consistently parking their vehicles on the street every day.

Temporary means every now and then, not every single day.

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN FOR YOU? You must use your garage and driveway to park your vehicles. The HOA will start giving notices to residents who have cars on the street while they have space in the driveway. It is your responsibility to rotate your cars if your driveway is free.

We will continue to give notices to vehicles left on the street for longer than the twenty-four (24) hour period of time.

I would highly recommend getting used to following this rule.

Once the HOA board is run by the neighborhood they will

not be as lenient as the developer has been!

### **Proper Placement Example**




### Improper Placement Example



#### Protective Covenant Item 24. ACCUMULATION OF REFUSE:

If trash or other refuse is to be disposed of by being picked up and carried away on a regular and recurring basis, containers must only be placed in the open on any day that a normal pick up is to be made, at such place on the property to provide access to persons making such pick up. At all other times such containers shall be stored in such manner so that they cannot be seen from adjacent and surrounding property.

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN FOR YOU? Your trash can must be kept at the side of your home, behind your fence, or in your garage. At the front of your home, on your front patio, in front of your garage, or at the street are not acceptable. your can should only remain at the curb on your scheduled service days.



Note: Your garbage days are Monday & Thursday, your trash day is Wednesday. However, during holiday weeks the Sanitation Department will not pick up trash. Please check the schedule before placing trash at the curb. We would like to limit trash being left at the curb for a week+ because of a holiday schedule change.
